



8 August 2022	Drigg Beach South of car park	Seal (dead) – 5ft long	Sadie Clarke reported to Client that a man had found a seal ten days previously. The man showed her photographs of the carcasses on his mobile phone.	
16 August 2022	Whitehaven	H a r b o u r porpoise	Unusual reports of porpoises near Whitehaven Harbour. Thought to be possible displacement of population.	Reported in local media – see here

18 August 2022	Drigg Beach ½ mile south of car park	Harbour porpoise (dead) – 110cm Seal (dead) – 220cm, fat, no obvious wounds	Reported to Cetacean Strandings Investigation Programme (“CSIP”).	Sadie Clarke
18 August 2022	Anthorn, near Silloth	B a r r e l j e l l y f i s h (dead)	Reports of around 250 washing up on beach	Reported in local media – see here .

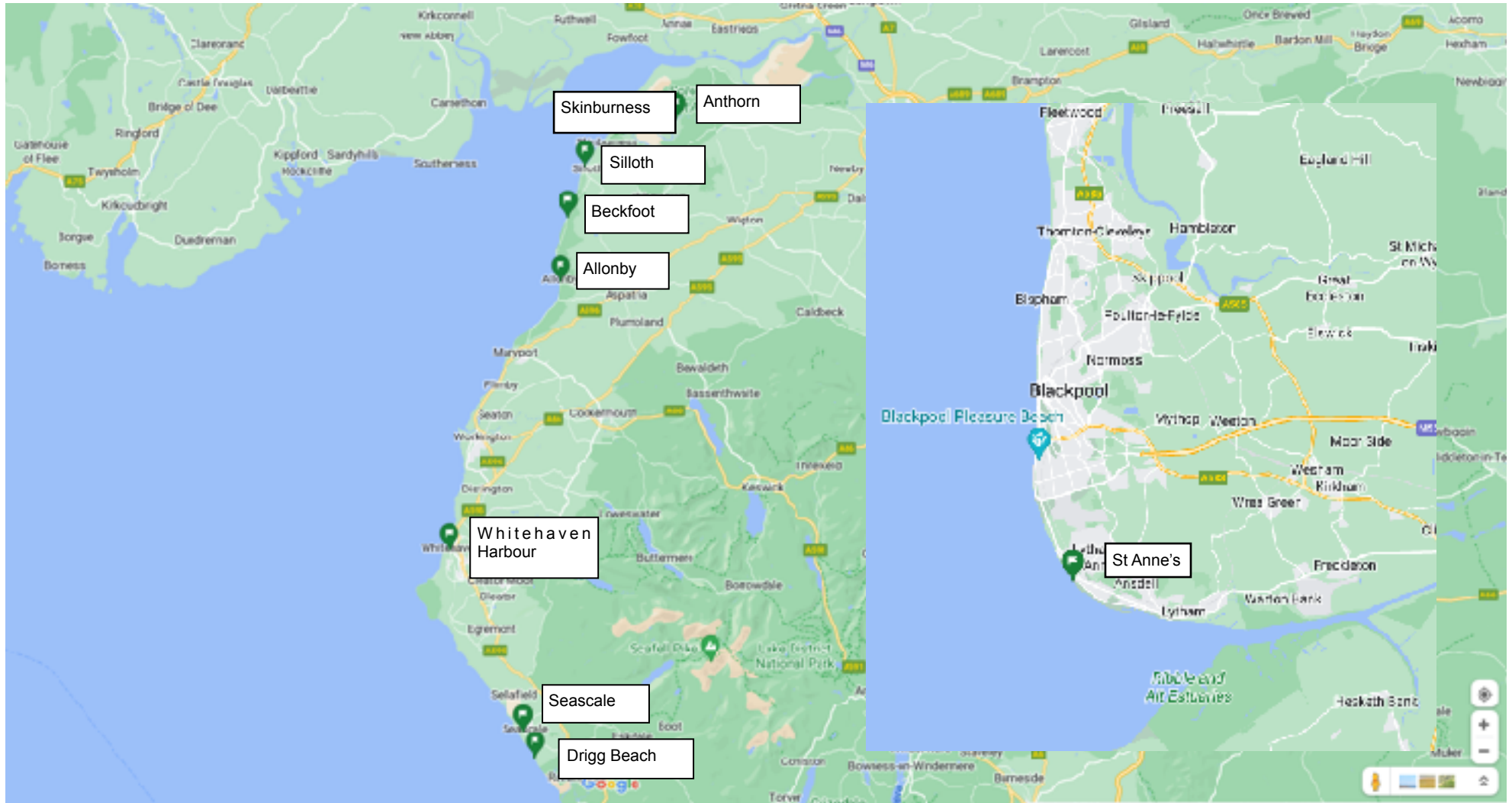

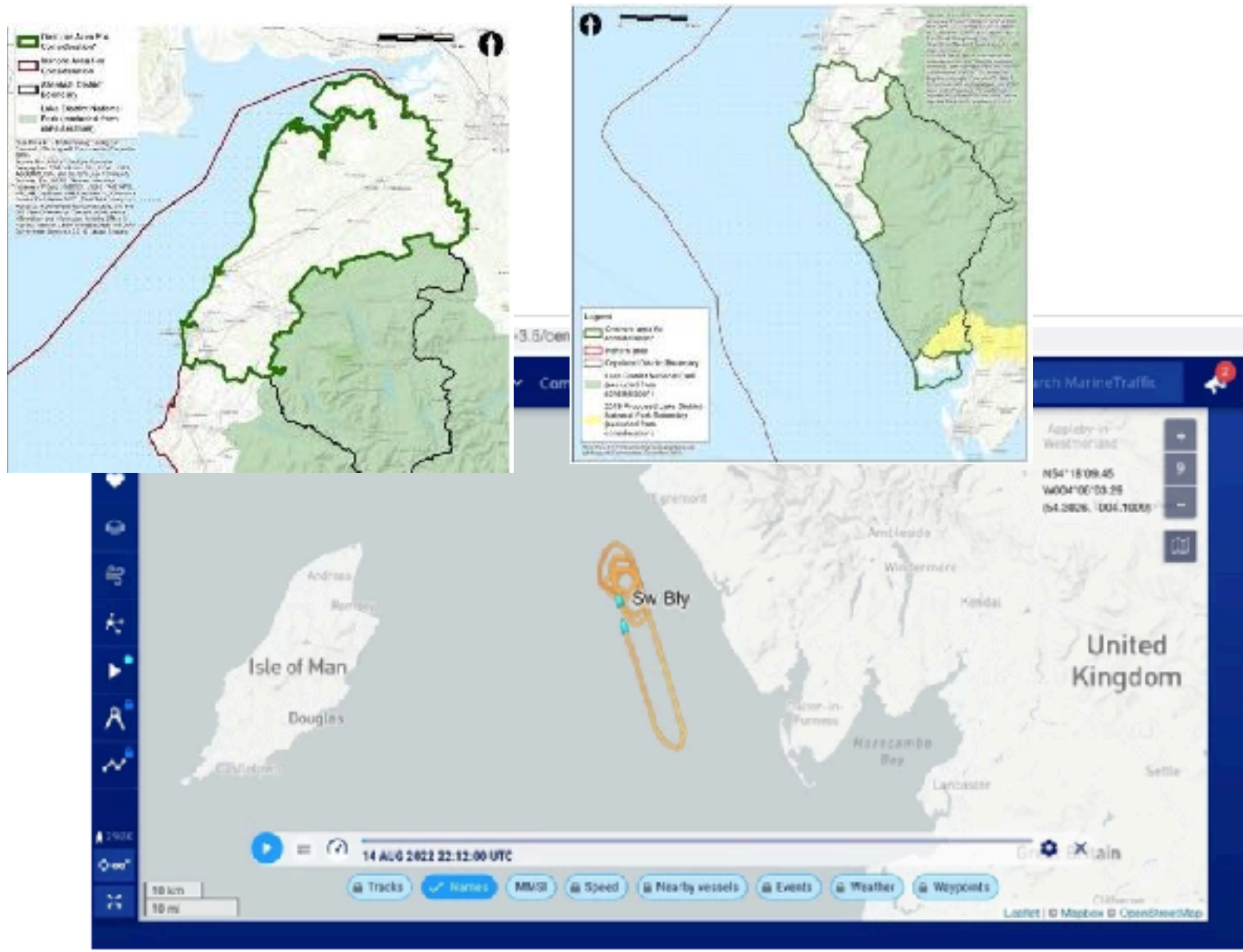
